

The donation represents money raised from in-store CHF icon sales, donations from the Whitehead family and a portion of the store's custom-made cake orders and t-shirt sales this summer. Since 2012, the Whiteheads have donated more than \$6,300 to CHF.



Members of the VCU Engineering Student Council Gala Planning Committee posed on the stairs at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts' Marble Hall, the site of the organization's annual celebration in April. The event, which raised \$1,500 for CHF, was attended by VCU graduate and undergraduate engineering students, faculty, staff and guests and highlighted the School of Engineering's accomplishments and goals.



The City of Richmond Fire Department taught children about important fire safety topics at Children's Hospital Foundation's Fire Prevention Day on October 6. Nearly 400 children from local schools and day cares attended the event to learn about fire safety and prevention through interactive displays presented by area fire departments, City of Richmond Police Department, Richmond Ambulance Authority and other community partners.



Stephanie Allan, Vice President for Community Development, CHF, accepted a check for \$4,378 from members of the Steel City Connection, a group of Pittsburgh sports fans, in September. Funds were raised during the 2014-15 Steelers season. Since 1991, the group has donated \$58,214 to CHF.



Employees from Cummins Atlantic raised \$3,020 during a Corn Hole Tournament in September to benefit Children's Hospital Foundation. The company has donated \$6,997 from three events since 2012.



Tom and Lea Cunningham presented a check for \$13,730 to Stephanie Allan, Vice President for Community Development, CHF, this fall. Funds were raised from a party and silent auction with the Cunningham's families and friends and will be used to support the Child Life Department at CHoR's MCV Campus. Combined with two previous events, the Cunninghams have donated more than \$31,000 for Child Life.
